Many Morrow county farmers are interested in planting windbreaks or shelterbelts on their farms this spring. Sam Heath and Oren Brace, Heppner; David Baker and W. H. Zinter, Ione; D. J. Phillips and Paul Slaughter, Irrigon, and C. E. Stalcup, Boardman, are farmers who have ordered trees from the state forest through this office. A total of six thousand trees was ordered

which will provide windbreaks and make farm living more enjoyable for those farmers. Trees are available at \$2.50 per thousand f.o.b. Corvallis. Douglas fir, Ponderosa pine, Scotch pine, Chinese Arborvitae, Arizona cypress, black locust and Russian olive are recommended for Eastern Oregon. Orders must be received by March 1, so if you are planning to put out a shelterbelt this year, better get your order in now.
