of 10 gallons of water per acre. (A gallon or two one way or the other will not harm as long as the proper amount of 2.4-D is being applied.) (2) A pint of the ester 2,4-D is to be applied per acre. At least a pint per acre should be applied regardless of one and one-half pints of ester 2.4-D have shown equal kill, If is advanced in growth, one and a half pints are recommended. A canvas shroud over the boom will prevent excessive drift of dust and spray, especially if applied in a strong breeze. Farmers who are just now get-

ting equipment in readiness for applying 2,4-D should keep these points in mind. There is plenty of time to apply the 2,4-D so do not hurry into the job with improper equipment. Charts for determining rates of application at different speeds with varying spacing of nozzles and sizes by pressure applied are available at at this office.
