Provided that permits to carry on controlled burning of vegetative cover or brush may be issued by the Bureau of Land Management in proper cases, such permits to be subject to such conditions as the Bureau of Land Management may see fit to impose, and all State laws and regulations concerning such burning."

**News From C. A. Office**

Bureau of entomology representatives responsible for the Morrow cricket control program made a progress report to farmers from Morrow, Gilliam and Sherman counties at a meeting held in the Vendome hotel at Arlington on May 12. Bert Johnson, county judge; George Miller, Albert Lindstrom, Dick Wightman and John Krebs were those from Morrow county attending the meeting.

Showers and heavy rains have slowed up control operations considerably this spring. Much of the area has been baited two or more times due to rains. Up to this time baiting has been done in large hatching areas where crickets were concentrated on or near egg beds. This method of control has ended in Morrow county where crickets are now migrating. Large flocks of gulls are working on the crickets in Morrow county, starting at the east portion of the infested area and have now worked past the Boardman project.

It was agreed that county funds (county court and voluntary contributions) would be used to put baiting and mixing crews on a seven-day week. Farmers are being called upon to scout the areas adjacent to their crops and begin baiting now before damage is done. Baiters are available commercially and a few owned by the bureau of entomology can be arranged for use by contacting the bait mixing station at Boardman.

Farmers who desire building plans for anything from a dairy barn to a merry-go-round for the kids can get them now through the Oregon State College building plan service. Detailed instructions and working drawings are available for scores of structures and equipment such as farm houses, grain elevators, cattle feeders, garages and buckrakes.

To make the farm builder's blueprint-hunting job easier, M. G. Huber, extension agricultural engineer, has indexed the available plans in an extension circular No. 487, entitled, "O.S.C. Farm Building Plan Service Listing Farm Houses, Farm Buildings and Equipment Plans Available." This 26-page mimeographed booklet, which contains information about each of the plans, is available at this office or by writing direct to the college.

Ninety-two separate listings are included in the publication. Many of the items, farm houses, for example, have a number of variations to meet particular building needs. For more detailed information than is contained in the circular, the county agricultural agent has a manual giving full descriptions of the plans covered.


Working drawings may be ordered for any specific plan for a nominal charge of 25 cents for each sheet plus an additional order charge of 35 cents. Some of the more complicated plans contain several sheets while others are complete on one page. However, the order charge of 35 cents will cover any number of sheets for one or more requests if the number of different sets of plans are ordered at one time.

Most of the structures listed in the circular have gone through the test of actual use. Consequently, they are suitable for the particular purpose for which they were designed from the standpoint of sound construction, convenience, sanitation and economy. Such conditions as rain, wind, altitude, temperature—all are considered in the construction of farm buildings.
