Two years of residence with their husbands in the United States is the prime requirement for naturalization of alien war brides, the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs was informed this week

They must, however, be married and living with their hus-bands during this time. Divorce, or separation because of death or for other reasons, will cause another year's extension of the waiting period, the immigration bureau said. Citizenship is not compulsory, it was pointed out.

The so-called war bride act expires this December 31, as does the alien fiancee act. Wives or fiancees of servicemen or veterans actually must be on United States soil to meet the deadline.

The two-year waiting period for citizenship for fiancees starts after the date of marriage and the presentation of necessary documents to the immigration bu-


