STATE'S STREETS-14 Oregon's streets and highways were busier than usual in November as gasoline use rose 14 per cent over the same month a year ago, Secretary of State Earl T Newbry has reported. Sales total-ed 37.348,030 gallons, he said.

At the same time, the secretary announced that motor vehicle registrations may have reached the 600,000 mark by the end of 1948. Licenses had been issued to vember, with December figures incomplete
