As to color beige and cream color are pushing the gray into the background. Dark blue is very good, especially with white trim. Brown and violet are two other very popular basic colors this season. To go with these are the red-orange, tangerine, peach and pale pink. Sea foam, jade, and flame are coming up the popularity ladder, too.
