## News From C. A. Office

Rats living in Morrow county are having a tough time of it these days. It all started on February 23 when the first eight rat control demonstrations were held at the Donald Heliker farm near Ione. Before the three days of demonstrations were over two hundred fifty pounds of red squill prepared bait and one hundred twenty gas cartridges have been sold. Farmers are still calling at this office for the bait it seems that the word gets around fast that an excellent kill has been obtained from the bait that has been put out.

Another one hundred pounds has just been received. It is still fresh and ready to make a good kill of rats on your farm. It is being sold at cost ready mixed and easily put out around farm buildings.

A bait the size of a walnut is put into each hole, rat runway, or among feed sacks... even where damage is being done to hay. Baiting is again done in six weeks to get any rats that were too young to take bait or that moved into buildings after the first baiting.

Attendance from Morrow county was very poor at the Cricket Control association meeting held at the Vendome hotel in Arlington, Thursday afternoon, March 24. Byrne Thrallkill and Rufus Wells of the Bureau of Entomology, and Robert Every, extension entomologist, Oregon State college, were present to discuss control needs for 1949. The Morrow county court and a representative of the Gilliam county court were present to discuss financing the program. The bureau of entomology has available all equipment that was used in this area last year which will be available for use this year.

Mr. Thrallkill told the group present that there was approximately 54,000 acres of cricket infested land in the area to be baited this year. In the Butter creek-Sand Hollow area crickets are expected to hatch in the cropland. Early baiting by farmers will have to be done in this area if crickets hatch as expected.

Poison bait to be used this year will be toxaphene treated wheat bran which is an improvement over the bait formerly used. The advantage of this bait is its long killing effect which lasts for 30 days longer. It can be put out at any time as it does not need to be moist to get a kill of crickets.

Baiting is expected to get underway soon after April 1. Bait and some equipment for use by farmers will be available at Boardman.

**HOME EXTENSION PROGRAM PLANNED FOR 1949-50**

Morrow county is the first county to have its 1949-50 home extension program planned. Eighteen homemakers met last Thursday, March 24, in the court room to select the final program.

Previous to this meeting, each unit had submitted to Miss Mabel Wilson, home demonstration agent, lists of their needs and wants for the coming year. Along with this list, trends in the various homemaking fields were discussed. The report of the Farm Home and Rural Life committee was read. Suggestions from the floor were received. Presiding over the morning session was Mrs. Russell Miller, Boardman. Presiding during the afternoon was Mrs. E. M. Baker, Ione.

Mrs. Azalea Sager, state leader in home economics extension, was present to help the group in selecting their major and minor courses.

In view of previous programs offered in Morrow county, the following program was selected:

**Topics for Monthly Unit Meetings—each unit chooses seven.**

Clothing and textiles: 1. Children's clothing; 2. Blouse in a day; 3. Finishes of wool dresses. Home furnishings: 1. Home dyeing; 2. Rug making; 3. Footstools; 4. New household fabrics and how to handle them.

Nutrition: 1. Adding interest to meals; 2. Making the most of the food dollar.

The Better Dress Workshop will be held in addition to the workshop on slip covers. If Miss Wilson's schedule allows.

A sewing machine clinic will be held late in June to which homemakers may bring their machines and learn how to make minor repairs and adjustments.

Two project leaders training meetings will be given on gift wrapping and child care.

A series of four recreation training meetings will be given in the fall. Tentatively planned in cooperation with commercial firms and the agricultural agent are meetings on home beautification and better use of electric power and appliances.

**61 Dresses Completed**

Here they learned importance of cutting on straight of materials, correct marking, besides learning better methods of setting sleeves, making buttonholes, hems, and other finishing details.
