

COURT PROCEEDINGS FOR MARCH, 1949

The minutes of the February, 1949 term were read and approved.

Harold Sherer has been appointed as foreman of the road department. A foreman was appointed for the bridge crew and one for the rock crushing and power shovel and they are to be responsible to Harold Sherer. The above foreman salary not to exceed a \$1.50 per hour.

Raymond Ferguson was appointed a member of the fair board to fill the unexpired term of Garnet Barratt, resigned. The court appointed Norman Nelson of Lexington, and Carl Bergstrom of Eightmile to serve on the Morrow County Budget Committee for a period of three years; also, Arthur Allen of Boardman is appointed for a two year term to fill the unexpired term of Russell K. Miller, commissioner.

Soil Conservator

One of the most talked about farming areas in the Pacific Northwest—Goldendale, Wash.—will take time out May 7 to run off its conservation-packed Field Day.

"Farmers and city folks are welcome to come and see what 'conservation farming' can do for agriculture," a spokesman for the Central Klickitat conservation district, sponsor of the field day, said.

Visitors, who are expected to come from Washington, Oregon and Idaho farming communities, will see in the alfalfa-covered countryside surrounding Goldendale, one of the country's most successful change-overs of wheat summerfallow to alfalfa farming.

Early settlers first broke the lush bunchgrass sod of the Goldendale plateau in the "50's". Up to a few years ago, a wheat summerfallow rotation was the common practice. Wheat yields were good at first but dropped off to as low as 10 bushels per acre as soil fertility decreased.

In recent years many ranchers in the district have regained their losses by turning under their wheat and seeding to alfalfa hay for ten to 12 year periods, before again sowing wheat.

Dryland alfalfa has helped stabilize agriculture in the Central Klickitat district. With more and more of its farmers turning to production of a fine grade of alfalfa, Goldendale has become well known for its premium quality hay. The growth of its high protein alfalfa hay has also helped step up livestock ranching in the county.

Field Day visitors will see many good stands of alfalfa on route from Goldendale to the scene of the demonstration at the Sarafield ranch five miles southeast of town.
