George Sterritt and Chance Wilson drove to Hamilton Wednesday afternoon. They visited the Tom Ross sawmill below Hamilton.

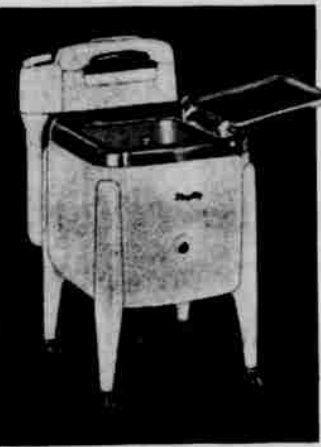

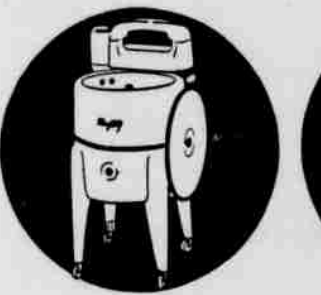
