Alder Street, Portland, Oregon, by previous notice made and published in the Oregon Journal and the Oregonian newspapers at least two weeks prior to said hearing, amended the regulations with respect to the open area and bag limit for the hunting of valley quail so as to read as follows:
"The open season for valley quail is from noon October 21 to October 30, both dates inclusive, in that portion of Lake county north of Valley Falls and west of U. S. Highway 395, in Klamath, Josephine, Jackson, Deschutes, Crook, Hood River, Wasco, Sherman, Gilliam, Wheeler, Morrow, Umatilla, Grant counties, and in that portion of Jefferson county outside of the Madras Irrigation Project.
"The bag limit for valley quail is eight birds in any one day and not more than twenty-four such birds during the entire season."
