Mr. and Mrs. Earl Johns and daughters drove to Hermiston Saturday. They spent the week-end with relatives and friends.

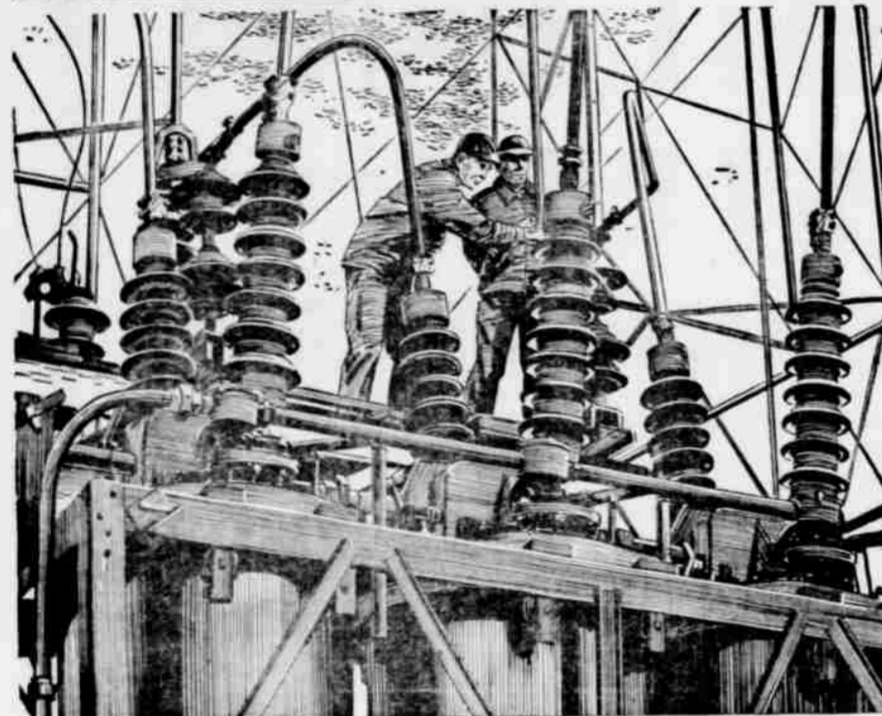
