## The American Way

TIME TO CLEAN HOUSE

By George Peck Toward the end of the 19th Century a most deplorable condi tion had developed in this coun try. Certain powerful capitalists, comprising but a small minority of the nation's businessmen, were operating their corporations solely for their own greedy gain, against the best interests of the

American people as a whole.

They oppressed workers by using force; they forced smaller competitors out of business; they bought votes with the money entrusted to them by investors; they shamelessly corrupted state legislatures; and even wrought their evil influence on the Federal Congress.
