Jim and Lonnie McCabe returned from central Oregon with

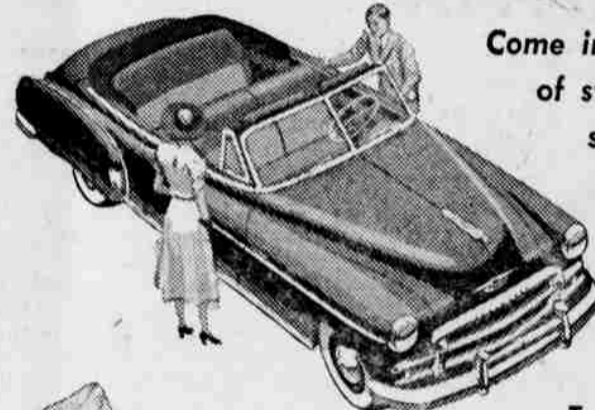
two antelope. They spent the week-end there hunting. Mr. and Mrs. Charles Ingalls and A. A. McCabe of Adams were

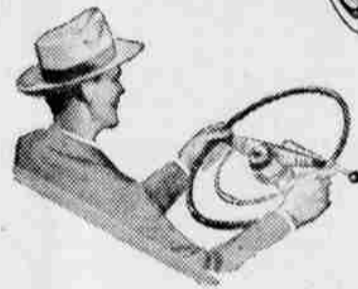
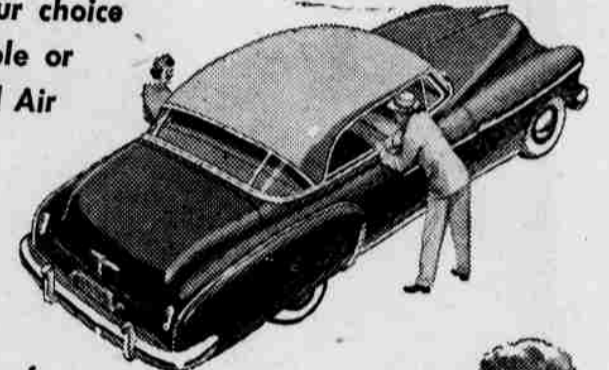

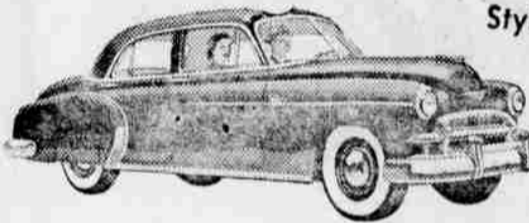
