Freedom Crusade Movement in County

J. O. Turner has accepted Morrow county chairmanship of the Crusade for Freedom organization, according to F. N. Belgrano, Jr., state chairman.

Belgrano expressed gratifica-tion that Turner has agreed to direct Morrow county's participation in the crusade campaign, which he said is primarily a mass movement intended to cre-ate and transmit effective anticommunist and pro-freedom intelligence, by radio broadcasts and other agencies, to the people of the prisoner countries behind the iron curtain and to the communist pressure.

The campaign will be officially launched on Labor day, September 4, Belgranosaid by a nation-wide radio address by Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower. For some six weeks thereafter organized effort will be made to enroll the names of millions of Americans on "Freedom Scrolls" to be cir-culated throughout the country, and finally to be permanently enshrined in the base of a huge 'Freedom Bell" in Berlin.
