

Oregon Motorists Rolled Most Miles In December, 1950

Oregon drivers rolled more miles in the final month of 1950 than in any previous December on record, Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry reported today. December travel, estimated at 462,217,750 miles, ran contrary to normal trend by exceeding mileage of the preceding month as holiday-bound motorists took to the roads, Newbry said. Mileage is computed from total gasoline sales reported to the secretary of state, using an average miles-per-gallon figure for vehicles of all types established by the federal public roads admin-

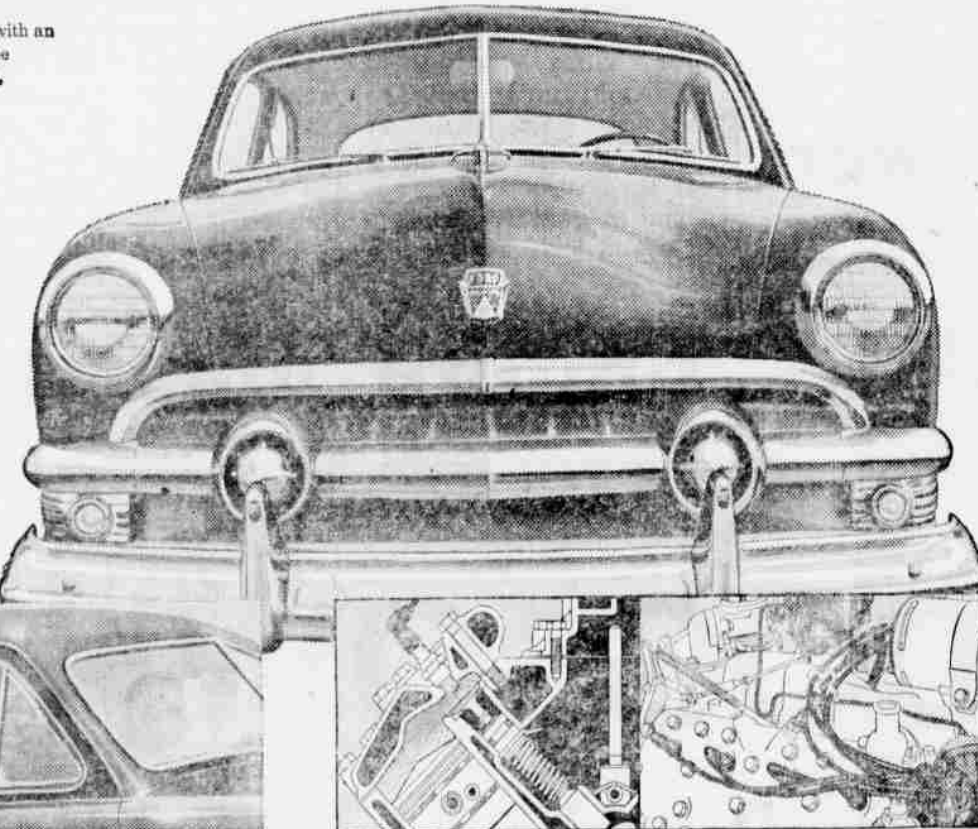

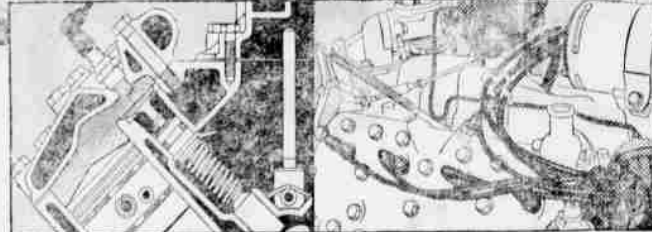
