

Court Proceedings For July, 1951

The minutes of the June term were read and approved. The Budget for the fiscal year July 1, 1951 to June 30, 1952 was ordered accepted as published and the levy is hereby extended on the tax roll of Morrow County, Oregon.

The Court ordered the following city levies to be extended by the Assessor:

City of Heppner	\$22,943.00
City of Ione	\$1,270.79
City of Lexington	\$2,718.00
City of Boardman	\$1,768.32

Also a 10 mill levy on all taxable property in the City of Heppner, was approved by the voters for the purpose of constructing a sewer system.

The Court ordered a .058 cent per acre levy on all taxable property for fire Patrol purposes as set out by the State Forester.

The Court ordered the Rural School District Levy of \$310,156.00 for the Fiscal Year July 1, 1951 to June 30, 1952 to be placed upon the tax rolls of the County, which said levy includes all of the School Districts of the County.

The Court orders the following Special Levies on the rolls as voted by the following School District: School District No. 35—\$1,000.

The Court ordered the salaries of the office help and janitor be increased as follows:

Deputy Assessor from \$200.00 to \$225.00 per month.
Deputy Clerk from 190.00 to 215.00 per month.
Deputy Tax Collector 225.00 to 250.00 per month.
Sheriff Office Help 150.00 to 166.66 per month.
Janitor 225.00 to 250.00 per month.

The County Court did provide and appropriate the sum of \$6,700.00 for use in and about agricultural or farm demonstration and field work in said county of Morrow, State of Oregon, during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1951 and ending June 30 1952, to be expended as in Sections 31-302 and 31307, subject to the supervision of the State Agricultural College of the State of Oregon.

The Court ordered that Lot A of the City of Boardman lying between Block 1 and 10 be given to the City of Boardman, to be used as a public street and that a Quitclaim Deed be executed by the County Court of Morrow County deeding said Lot A to the City of Boardman.

The Court ordered that the Election Precincts of Eight Mile and Pine City be abolished and that the territory covered by them be put in other precincts as follows:

Adding to the Ione Precinct that part of Eightmile Precinct described as follows: Beginning at the Northwest Corner of Section 6, Township 3 South of Range 23 E.W.M., said point being on the line between Morrow and Gilliam Counties, running thence East 9 miles to the Northeast Corner of Section 4, Township 3 South, Range 24, E.W.M., thence South 3 miles to the Southeast corner of Section 16, Township 3 South, Range 24, E.W.M., thence West 3 miles to the Southeast Corner of Section 13, Township 3 South, Range 23, E.W.M., thence South 3 miles to the Southeast Corner of Section 36, Township 3 South, Range 23 E.W.M., thence West 6 miles on the County line to the Southwest Corner of Township 3 South of Range 23, E.W.M., thence North 6 miles on the County line to the place of beginning. All of the remainder of the Eightmile Precinct is hereby added to and made part of the South Heppner Precinct.

All that part of the Pine City Precinct lying North of the Base Line is added to and made part of the Lexington and all that part of the said Pine City Precinct lying South of the Base Line is hereby added to and made part of the North Heppner Precinct.

The Court orders the levy of 4 mills of the Irrigon Rural Fire Protection District for the Fiscal Year July 1, 1951 to June 30, 1952, extended on the Tax Rolls.

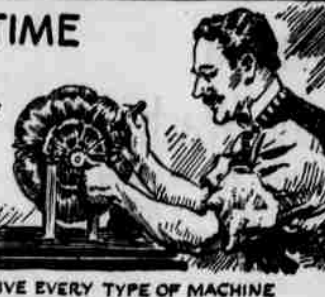

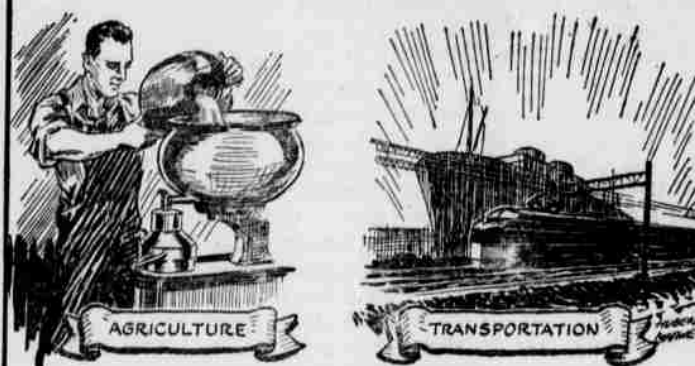
