FRANCINE HISLER SETS WEDDING DATE

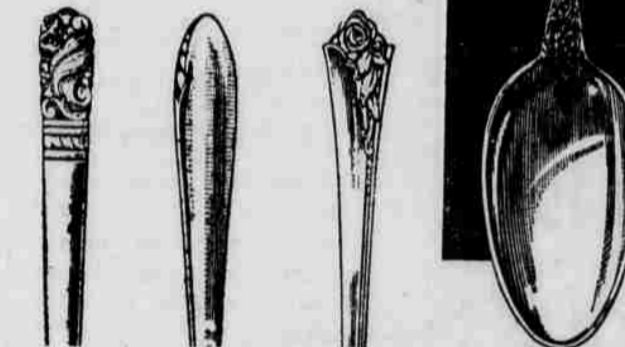
