Nevada Man Named To Head Animal Diagnostic Lab

Nevada Man Named New Head
Plans are now in the final stage for establishing an animal diagnostic laboratory in the veterinary department of the Oregon State college experiment station, according to F. E. Price, dean and director of agriculture at OSC. The laboratory will serve veterinarians of the state department of agriculture who are engaged in inspection work.

Dr. Raymond L. Vawter, associate veterinarian at the University of Nevada, has been appointed veterinarian in charge of the new laboratory, subject to the approval of the state board of higher education, Dean Price announced.

At the same time, the OSC dean reported that construction plans for a building to house the laboratory on the OSC campus are in final form. Work will get underway shortly, with completion expected this winter. The building will be located southwest of poultry-veterinary hall, he said.

Funds totaling \$40,000 were appropriated by the state legislature at its last session for equipping and operating the laboratory during the current biennium.

Dr. Vawter, the newly appointed veterinarian, has been with the veterinary department of the Nevada experiment station since 1920. He is a graduate of Kansas State college and received a master's degree from Cornell univer-

sity, Ithaca, New York.

At Nevada, he has been intimately associated with diagnostic and investigational work on red water disease of cattle, equine encephalitis, infectious and nutritional diseases of farm animals and poisonous range plant problems.

Dr. Vawter is author or co-author of some 40 experiment station bulletins and scientific articles. He is past president of

the Intermountain Veterinary Medicine association and twice has been appointed president of the Nevada Veterinary Medicine association.

In announcing the appointment, Dean Price expressed satisfaction in being able to obtain a man with such outstanding qualifications to take over the laboratory and get the service properly organized.
