Ag Conference Plans Explained In New Circular

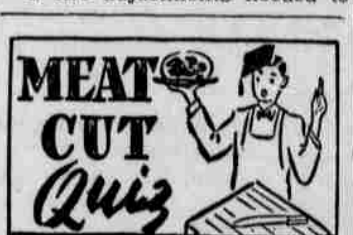
A folder explaining the background and organization objectives of the statewide agricultural conference to be held on the Oregon State college campus next March has been released by the extension service.

The three-day conference, the folder says, is a meeting of rural and urban people interested in agriculture and rural homes. Committees of farm people, assisted by technical consultants, will present reports given their views as to needs and opportunities for developing Oregon agriculture and rural living during the next 10 to 25 years.

The first conference of this type was held at the college in 1924.

Among many economic questions to be considered by the conference are:

1. Should Oregon farms direct production to Pacific coast market demands?
2. How can farm forest products achieve a position of importance among the large number of crops grown in the state?
3. What should be done to translate economic returns into better rural living?
4. Are adjustments needed to



- Q. What are these meat cuts called?
A. Beef short ribs.
- Q. Where do they come from and how are they identified?
A. They are cut from ends of beef ribs and contain layers of lean and fat.
- Q. How are they prepared?
A. By braising or cooking in liquid. In both cases the meat is first browned. In braising from ¼ to ½ cup of liquid is added, the utensil covered and the meat cooked until tender. When cooking in liquid, the short ribs are completely covered with water, the utensil covered and the meat simmered for 1½ to 2 hours.
