

Court Proceeding For September 1951

The minutes of the August term were read and approved.

The Court ordered that a permit system, with uniform regulations, for hauling of logs over the County roads be set up as provided in Chapter 405 1951 session laws, upon the execution of the same the Law Enforcement Officers of the County be asked to cooperate in regularly enforcing the same.
