NOTICE OF FILING APPLICATION FOR A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION OF WATER

Notice is given hereby that Newt O'Hara has filed an application for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Willow Creek.

In the adjudication proceedings determining the relative rights to the use of waters of Willow Creek and its tributaries, a water right was adjudicated in the name of Jane Penland for the irrigation of 16 acres in the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 and 1 acre in the NW 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 34 and 12 acres in

the NW 1/4 SE 1/4, 20 acres in the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 and 15 acres in the SE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 35, Township 1 South, Range 25 East, W. M., through the Penland and Yokum Ditches near Willow Creek.

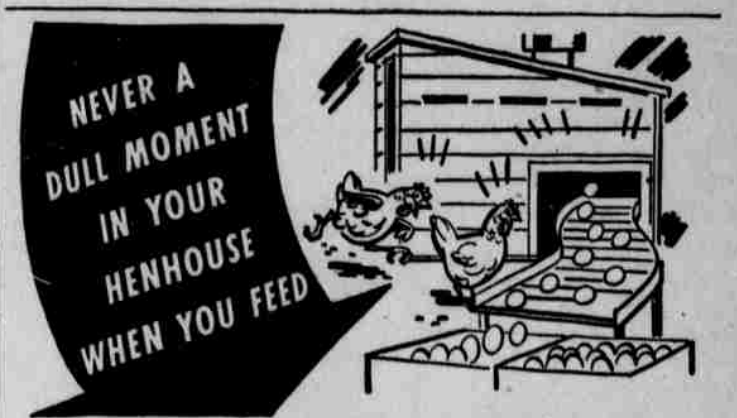
Local Women To Attend Health Meet
