LET'S END JAYWALKING

Jaywalker! Even the name is ugly. Named for the jaybird—a saucy chatterer, an impudent, discourteous fellow. The traffic "jaywalker" is the pedestrian who walks out of turn or out of place. Jaywalkers are the chief cause of pedestrian accidents, says the AAA driver training book, "Sportsmanlike Driving."

A very few bad things that pedestrians do cause most of the pedestrian deaths or injuries. Practically all of these things are jaywalking acts — both illegal and unsportsmanlike.

Of every 100 pedestrians killed or hurt in traffic, almost half of them were crossing the street in mid-block, away from a crosswalk. Many were crossing against the signal lights. Or they were darting out from between parked cars. Or they were walking or playing in the street.

Avoid these few jaywalking practices, and more than double your chance for safety on the street. Don't be a pedestrian casualty. Avoid the practices which spot you as a traffic jay!
