Notice is hereby given that Ralph J. Taylor has filed an application for the approval of changes in points of diversion of water from Willow Creek.

In the adjudication proceedings determining the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of Willow Creek and Its Tributaries, a watershed was adjudicated in the name of Wm. B. Ewing for domestic purposes and the irrigation of 135 acres with a date of priority of 1892 and 104 acres with a date of priority of 1906, in Sections 7, 8, and 17, T. 2 N., R. 23 E., W. M., through the Ewing, Desert Land, Kirtzley, Underground, Murphy and Highline ditches.

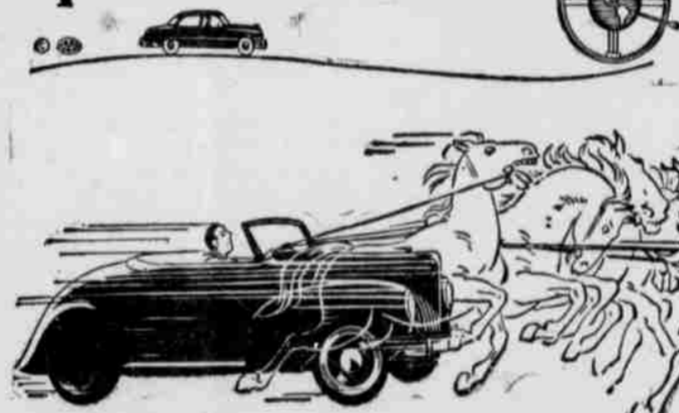
