Young Adults Met At Nash Home

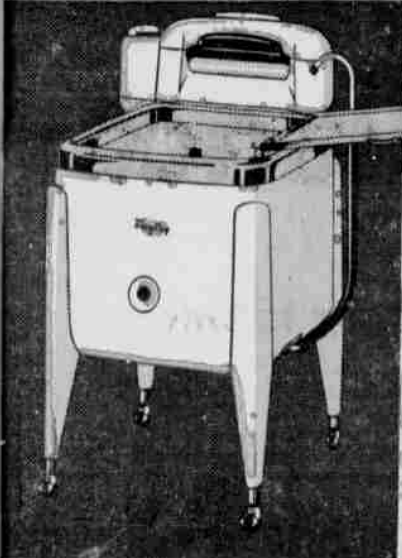

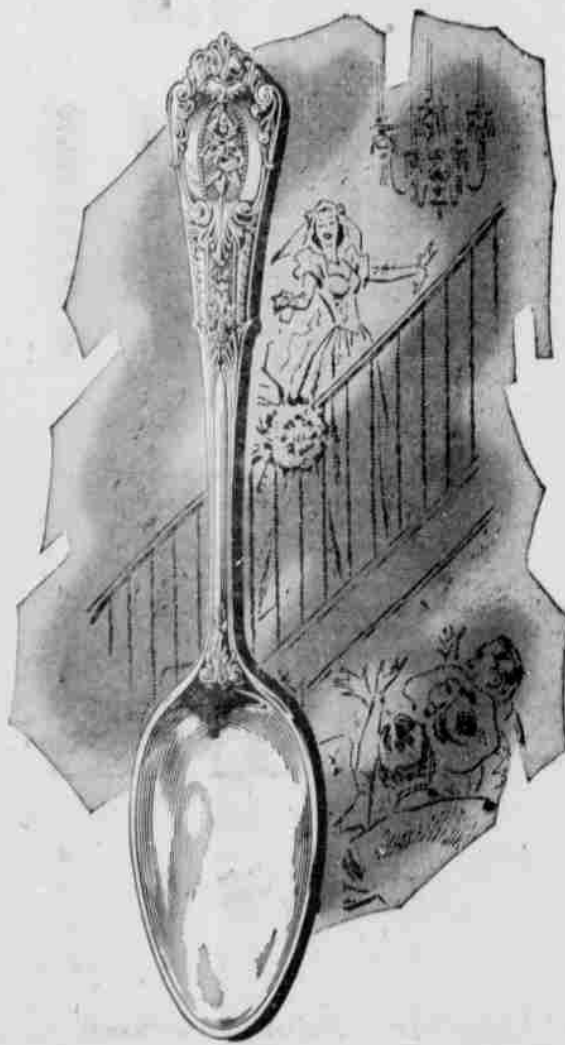
