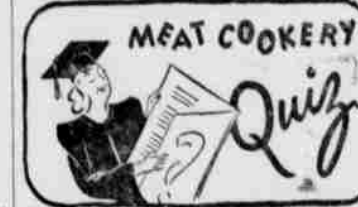

Q. What is this method of meat cookery? A. Broiling — cooking by direct heat.

The meat is broiled until cooked approximately half way through, then seasoned, turned and cooked on the second side, seasoned and served immediately.
