NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION STATE OF OREGON COUNTY OF MORROW SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 35 CJ

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the School District Bond Election hereby called to be held at School House in and for School District No. 35 CJ of Morrow County, Oregon, in the City of Lone, County of Morrow Oregon, on the 8th day of May, 1952, between the hours of two o'clock P. M. and eight o'clock P. M. Pacific Standard Time there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of Two Hundred Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$235,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds with which to construct, equip, erect and furnish a school building in and for said District, and to acquire all property, real and personal, appurtenant thereto or connected therewith.

The vote to be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Bonds—Yes" and "Bonds—No"; and the voters shall place a cross (X) between the words "Bonds" and the word "Yes", or between the words "Bonds" and the word "No", which ever indicates his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the contraction of said indebtedness will, on said day and date and at the place aforesaid, be opened at the hour of two o'clock P. M., Pacific Standard Time, and remain open until the hour of eight o'clock P. M., Pacific Standard Time, of the same day, when the same shall be closed.

Notice of School Election Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution

(Summary of Section 11, Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon) will be held in School District No. 101 of Morrow County, State of Oregon, from 2:30 P. M. to 3:30 P. M. on Thursday, May 15th, 1952 at City Hall in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year, 1952-1953 over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon. FOR THE RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT.

The reasons for increasing such levy are:

The low tax base due to the fact that some districts lost their base and others could only be increased 6% per year while costs have gone up more rapidly during and after the war years. Increased costs are due to increased cost of personnel, supplies, equipment, and services; to added services like transportation, hot lunches, music; to bringing school physical plants and equipment up to meet the required standards.

The total base for all districts in the Rural School District is \$115,191.60 and the total to be raised by tax is \$422,906.00. The amount of tax, in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said fiscal year is \$307,714.40.

To the Citizens of Morrow County

The Board of Trustees of the Pioneer Memorial Hospital feel that it would be of interest to the general public if a statement of the actual operation for the fiscal year 1951 was made available to the public; therefore, we are having published the profit and loss statement for the calendar year 1951 as shown by the certified audit report of Witherell & Witherell, Public Accountants of Pendleton, Oregon. Any person desiring to do so may examine the full audit report which is too detailed to have published at the office of the hospital or at the office of the County Judge where copies of the report are available.

It is the feeling of the Hospital Board that the taxpayers

of Morrow County did not expect the Hospital to repay from operating funds, the cost of the original building and equipment; however, the report contains a depreciation charge of \$11,087.64 which is amortizing the cost of the building and equipment. If this were excluded from the charges as shown by the report the Hospital would have shown an operating profit of \$4,870.98 which includes the amount received from the County Court of \$11,500.00, or an actual operating loss of \$6,629.02, which is considerable less than the estimated loss of \$12,000.00 per year as set up by the County Court at the time the Hill-Burton funds were secured to assist in the construction of said Hospital.
