**Dr. and Mrs. E. K. Schaffitz** and daughter spent the Memorial Day weekend visiting in the Wallace, Idaho area.

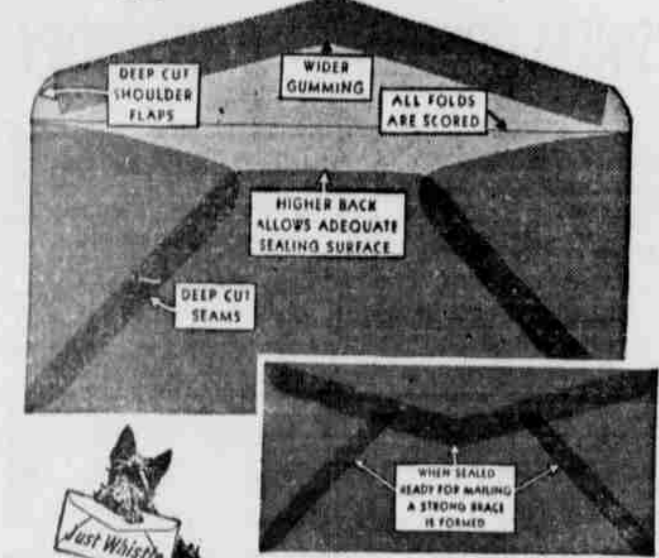
**Ellis Meriet** of Los Angeles, a brother in law of Henry Schwartz is visiting in Heppner this week.
