NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION OF THE WEST EXTENSION IRRIGATION DISTRICT NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN:

1. That a special election will be held in the West Extension Irrigation District, Umatilla County, State of Oregon on Saturday, the 21st day of June, 1952, for the purpose of determining whether the Board of Directors of the District shall be authorized for and on behalf of the District to enter into an amendment to the contract with the United States of America, acting through the Secretary of the Interior, in pursuance of the provisions of the Federal Reclamation Laws, these being the Act of June 17, 1902 (32 Stat. 388) and all acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto. The form of contract proposed to be entered into is a draft designated "R. O. Draft-3/17/52" which has been approved by the Secretary of the Interior, subject to such modifications as appear desirable to the District's Board of Directors to conform to the requirements of the Secretary and the District as of the time the contract is prepared for signature. Copies of the form of contract are available in the office of the District and the form of proposed contract appears in full attached to the minutes of the Board of Directors adopted on the 17th day of May, 1952, by which the Board approved the proposed amendatory repayment contract and called this special election. The form of contract and resolution are open to inspection by any elector of the District who is qualified to vote in this special election. The proposed amendatory repayment contract when executed by the parties thereto, stated in general terms, will contain provisions relating to the following matters, among

others: (a) Restating the District's obligation, rights and privileges with respect to the construction, operation and maintenance, and repayment of the West Division of the Umatilla Federal reclamation project, and amending and superseding all prior contracts between the District and the United States with respect to such project.

(b) Reducing the District's maximum repayment obligation from in excess of \$1,000,000 to \$233,175.69.

(c) Establishing the District's annual construction charge at \$1,426.50.

(d) Providing for the manner of operation of the project, including the accumulation and maintenance by the District of a reserve fund for unusual or extraordinary operation and maintenance costs of the District, indicating the limitations upon the delivery of water to holdings in a single ownership, providing for crop reports, the maintenance of books and records, the inspection of project works, the performance of work by the United States with contributed funds, the issuance of regulations, the giving of notices of the withholding of water in event of default, and other matters in pursuance of the Federal Reclamation Laws, these being the Act of June 17, 1902 (32 Stat. 388) and all acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto.

(e) So long as any of said bonds or any that may be issued to refund them shall be outstanding, the Council shall include in the annual tax levy of the City a sum sufficient with the aforesaid net revenues of the said sewer system and facilities, to pay the interest upon the principal of the said bonds as the said obligations respectively become due and payable. The said tax shall be levied upon an ad valorem basis upon all of the property within said City so taxable for its purposes.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the following ballot title is adopted for said amendment:

CHARTER AMENDMENT Submitted to the Voters by the Council.

Shall the Charter of the City of Heppner, Oregon, be amended by adding thereto Article _____, authorizing the Council to construct a complete sewer system and treatment and disposal facilities for said City, and the issuance of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) bonds to defray the cost thereof, authorizing the making of charges for use of the system, and a tax levy to pay said bonds.

Unless all bids are rejected, the bonds will be awarded to the bidder complying with the terms of the notice of sale, and submitting the bid which provides the lowest cost to the school district.

Each bid must be unconditional, must be accompanied by a certified check or cashier's check in favor of the district, of or upon a bank doing business in the state of Oregon, in the sum of \$4,700.00, and must be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the undersigned and marked on the outside "Proposal for Bonds". No interest will be allowed on the deposit with the bid, but the check of the successful bidder will be retained as part payment of the bonds or to secure the school district against any loss resulting from failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of his bid.
