NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION ON JUNE 24TH, 1952, IN THE CITY OF HEPPNER, OREGON NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special election has been called to be held in the City of Heppner on Tuesday, the 24th day of June, 1952. The polling place for said election will be at the Council Chambers, and the polls will be open from 8 o'clock A. M. until 5 o'clock P. M. Said election has been called for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters a charter amendment as provided in the following resolution:

RESOLUTION BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEPPNER, OREGON, that the following proposed amendment to the Charter of said City be and the same is hereby proposed for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection at a special election to be held as in this Resolution provided.

CHARTER AMENDMENT SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL AN ACT.

To amend the Charter of the City of Heppner, Oregon, by adding thereto Article authorizing construction of complete sewer system and disposal facilities, and the issuance of bonds in the sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) to provide funds therefor.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF HEPPNER, OREGON, that the Charter of said City be amended by adding thereto Article to read as follows:

Article

(a) The Council hereby is authorized to acquire, construct, install, operate, and maintain, within or without the corporate limits of said City, a complete sewer system and sewage treatment and disposal facilities and all equipment and appurtenances necessary, useful, or convenient thereto.

(b) For the purpose of providing funds with which to effectuate the purposes of this section, the Council is authorized to issue and sell at public sale, general obligation bonds of the City in the aggregate sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00). The said bonds shall be in such form and shall bear such issue and maturity dates as the Council shall determine, but all of said bonds shall mature within twenty-five (25) years from issue date. Should the Council so elect, it may issue the said bonds with the privilege reserved therein, of redeeming part or all of the bonds at par value and accrued interest, upon optional dates to be designated in the bonds. The said bonds shall be sold for not less than ninety-eight (98) per cent of the par value thereof and the full amount of accrued interest thereon.

(c) The debt limitations contained in the charter shall not apply to any of the bonds hereby authorized.

(d) The Council hereby is authorized and empowered to fix and determine rates and to collect charges for the use of said sewer system and facilities, and to pledge all or any part of the net revenues thereof, to the payment of the interest on, and to the retirement of the principal of, the bonds hereinabove authorized.

(e) So long as any of said bonds or any that may be issued to refund them shall be outstanding, the Council shall include in the annual tax levy of the City a sum sufficient with the aforesaid net revenues of the said sewer system and facilities, to pay the interest upon the principal of the said bonds as the said obligations respectively become due and payable. The said tax shall be levied upon an ad valorem basis upon all of the property within said City so taxable for its purposes.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the following ballot title is adopted for said amendment:

CHARTER AMENDMENT Submitted to the Voters by the Council.

Shall the Charter of the City of Heppner, Oregon, be amended by adding thereto Article authorizing the Council to construct a complete sewer system and treatment and disposal facilities for said City, and the issuance of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) bonds to defray the cost thereof, authorizing the making of charges for use of the system, and a tax levy to pay said bonds.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that this resolution for a proposed charter amendment submitted to the voters by the Council be filed with the Recorder for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection to be voted on at a special election.

which said election is hereby called to be held on the 24th day of June, 1952.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Recorder be and he is instructed to give notice of said election by publication of this resolution in full in Heppner Gazette Time, a newspaper published in the City of Heppner once each week for two successive weeks, the first publication thereof to be more than fifteen (15) days prior to the election. The Recorder shall also post notices of election in at least six (6) public and conspicuous places in the City at least ten (10) days prior to said election, which posted notice shall state the time, place and purposes of the election but need not contain the full amendment.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the 24th day of June, 1952, between the legal voting hours on said date, that is from 8 o'clock A. M. to 5 o'clock P. M., is hereby designated as the time for holding said election, and the following Judges and Clerks are hereby designated and appointed as the place and officials to conduct said election:

Polling Place: Council Chambers, in the City of Heppner, Oregon. Judges: R. B. Rice, and Flora Nys; Clerks: Ethel Adams, Genie Huston and Ealor Huston.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Recorder is instructed to notify said Judges and Clerks, prepare the necessary ballots and other election supplies, and take all other action necessary in the conduct of said election.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the City that the election herein provided for shall be held at as early a date as possible and in order so to do this resolution take effect immediately, NOW THEREFORE.

AN EMERGENCY is hereby declared to exist and this resolution shall go into force and effect upon its adoption and approval.
