Held In Ione Wed.

Carl William Swanson died
Sunday afternoon August 3 at the
Pioneer Memorial hospital in
Heppner after a long illness. Mr.
Swanson was born January 21,
1875 in San Jose, California and
came to Ione in 1903. He was
married to Katy Arvilla Petteys
April 10, 1904. He was engaged
in farming and carpentering and
in 1918 operated a feed mill. In
1924 he built and ran a grocery
store and had the first frozen food
lockers in Ione.

He is survived by his wife, one
son Carlton of Ione, two daughters,
Mrs. Cless (Norma) Rea of Ione,
and Mrs. Frank (Ruth) Lundell of
Portland and two sisters, Mrs.
Hilma Nelson of Firth, Idaho and
Mrs. Anna Nickle of Sumner,
Wash., ten grandchildren and one
great grandchild. A son, Elmer,
died October 1, 1927. The late
Emil Swanson was a brother.
