of Mr. and Mrs. M. V. Nolan; and Stephen Klinger, son of Mr. and Mrs. (Continued on page 3)

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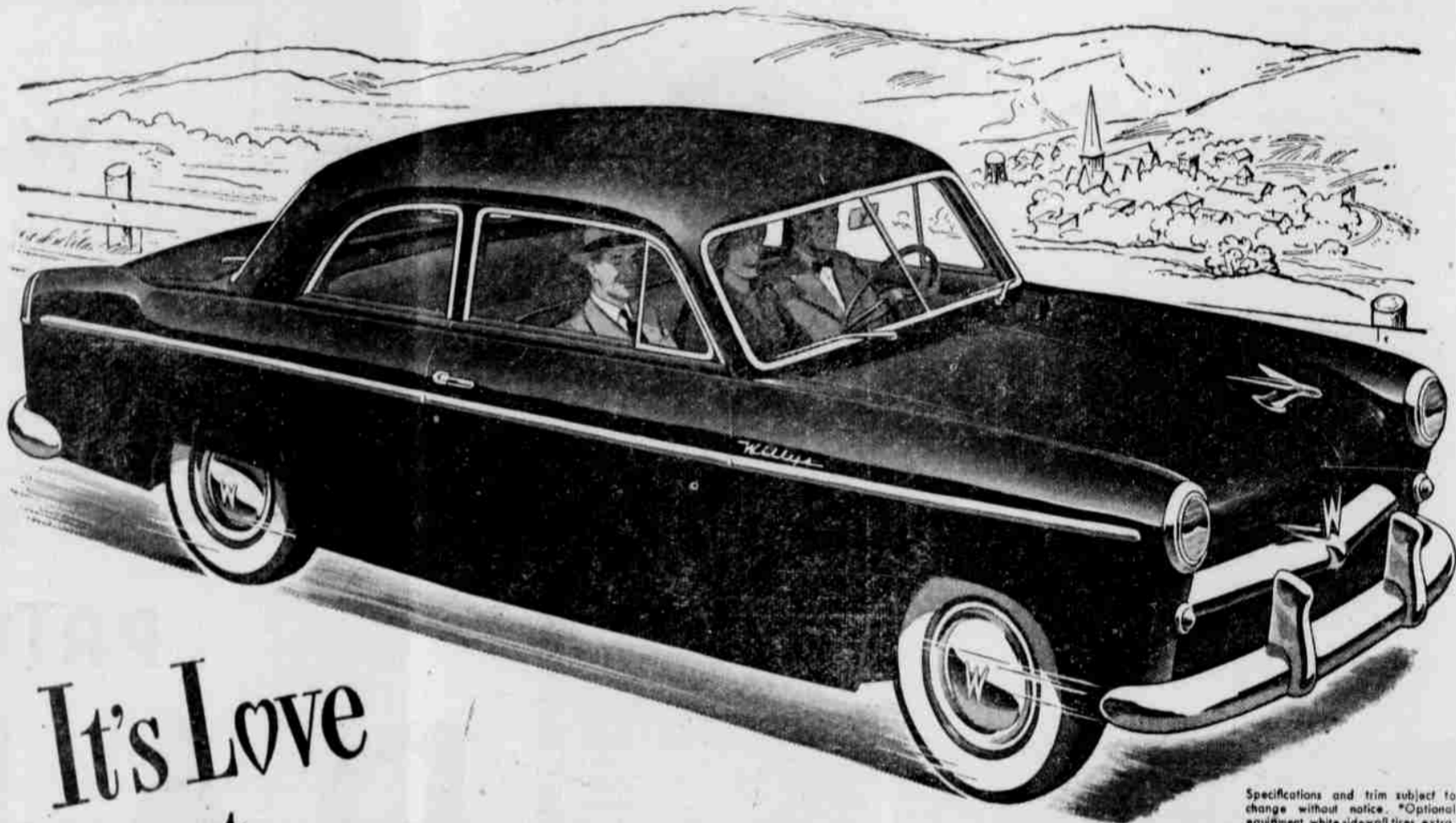
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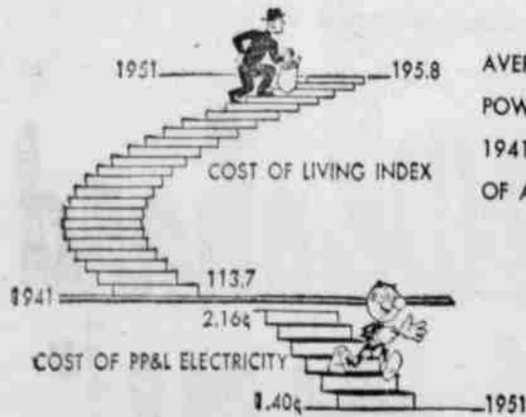
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
