criticisms. Miscellaneous? ART WORK leather work, ceramics, and what have you. Those of you that are hobby minded this is your spot. Bring it in, we'll find a place for your exhibit.

The Rodeo is a show, and a mighty fine one, in its own right, but to us it and the Fair are two units complimentary to each other. We think it gives well balanced entertainment. Don't you?

Morrow County ranchers may be interested in the meeting since negotiations will be completed at that time for cloud seeding for another year. At this same meeting, Mr. Bob Beaumont, of the Oregon State College Experimental station, will present the final report on the evaluation of the 1951-52 project.

These days, you might go out to the pasture and count how many bites each of your cows are taking each minute. Sound foolish? Lots of new things sound that way that eventually work into proven practices. Maybe, some day you will be hiring a grass-bite counter.

Over in Scotland they time their cows. They find that a good cow will take 70 bites a minute and that any cow that takes less than 50 bites a minute is headed for hamburger. They conclude that pastures should be managed in such a manner so that there is five inches or more of growth so that the animal can consume more roughage in less time. They further point out that the cow will put in an average of 7 1/2 hours every day eating whether it is on short grass or long grass. Therefore, on five inch grass in a 7 1/2 hour period, a cow can get 125 pounds inside of her. That is enough for a lot of milk and a satisfactory poundage of beef. On the other hand, in 7 1/2 hours a cow on short grass would consume 50 pounds or less which is not enough for heavy production.

Preserve your recipe clippings by enclosing them in waxed paper, cut to the size of a standard recipe card. With a warm iron press waxed paper to seal edges.

Nothing is more enticing to a wilted August appetite than a cool, colorful fruit salad. On individual plates arrange crisp lettuce, then lemon balls, pineapple, peaches and other fruit. Top with Green Mayonnaise, made by thinning real mayonnaise with lemon juice to taste, then tinting it a delicate green with vegetable food color.

A small soft brush is invaluable as a laundry aid. Use it to clean soiled glove fingertips, blouse necklines, cuff folds, slip straps and hemlines.

Here's a quick and delicious Coffee Teig for summertime cakes: Blend 3/4 cups sifted confectioners sugar, 1/2 cup soft vitaminized margarine, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 egg yolk and 5 to 6 tablespoons strong coffee. Beat until fluffy and easy to spread. Makes enough frosting for one 10-inch cake.

A little sugar added to the water in which you boil corn will add flavor. Do not add salt until corn is done for salt will toughen it.
