Mrs. Lake Bechner has as her guest Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Manning and boys of Connell, Washington.

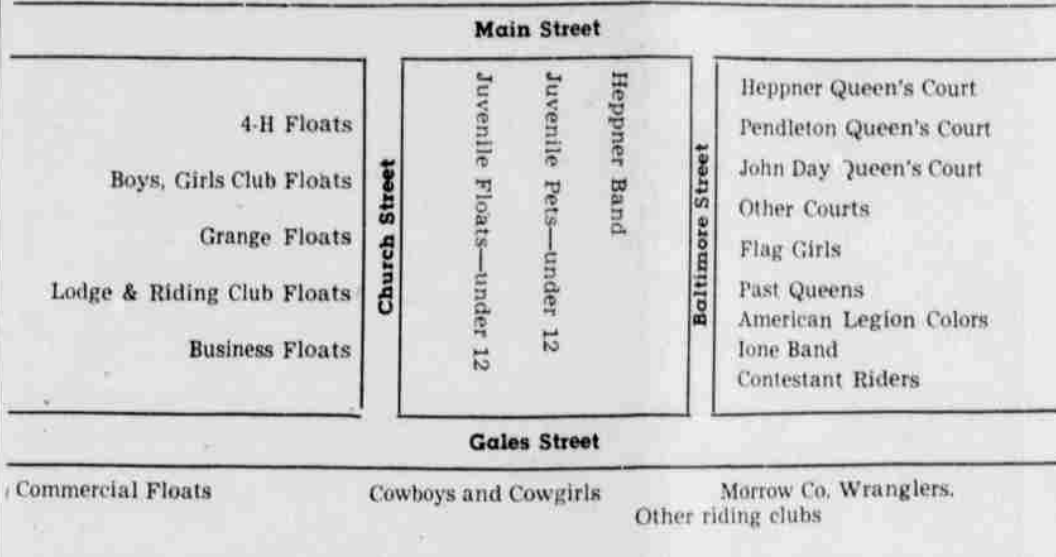

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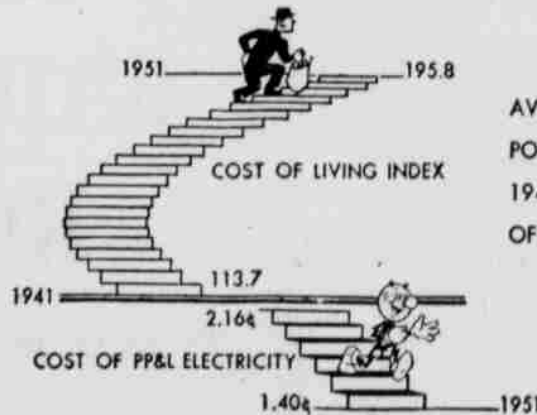
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
