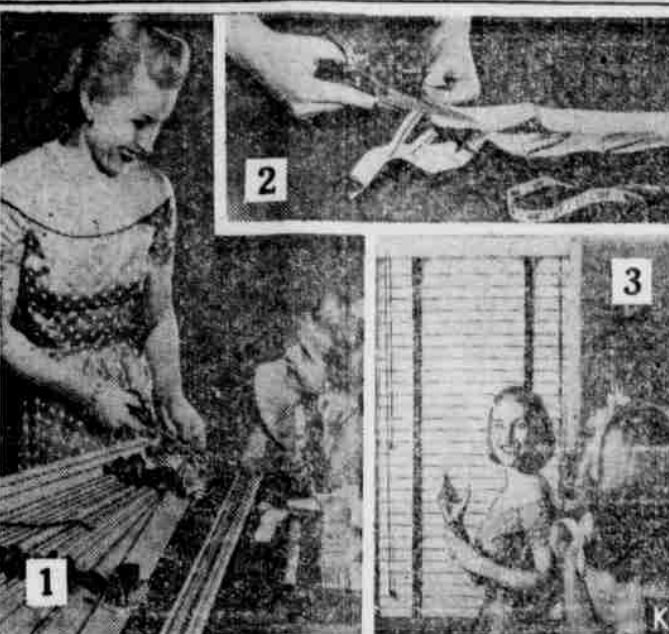
Mrs. Avery Taylor Honored By Shower
