School Bus Law Again In Effect

Oregon's law requiring motorists to stop for school buses that have stopped to load or unload children will soon call for renewed attention by Oregon drivers, the state traffic safety division reminded today.

Many buses have been transporting farm workers during the summer, an operation to which the stop law does not apply. The division said this fact confuses some motorists who are not aware that stops must be made only when the bus is carrying school children.

When the big yellow vehicles resume regular school runs this month, a loading or unloading stop means cars approaching from both directions must also stop, the division pointed out. Traffic so stopped may then proceed, provided no children are leaving the bus or crossing the roadway.

The law, adopted by the 1949 state legislature, exempts from stopping only vehicles approaching the bus from the opposite direction on the far side of a roadway having three or more lanes.
