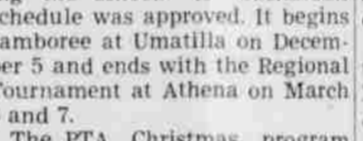

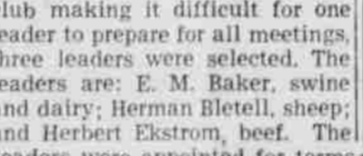
4-H CLUB NEWS
