NOTICE OF BOND SALE

The City of Heppner, Oregon, hereby invites sealed bids for the purchase of City of Heppner Sewage System Bonds in the principal sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00). Sealed bids must be received by the undersigned until 5:00 o'clock P. M. on December 15th, 1952. These sewage system bonds will be in denominations of \$1,000.00 each, dated November 1, 1952, and will mature serially in numerical order as follows:

\$8,000.00 on February 1, 1954;
\$9,000.00 on February 1st in each of the years 1955 to 1957, incl.;

\$10,000.00 on February 1st in each of the years 1958 to 1960, incl.;

\$11,000.00 on February 1st in each of the years 1961 to 1963, incl.;

\$12,000.00 on February 1st in each of the years 1964 to 1966, incl.;

\$13,000.00 on February 1st in each of the years 1967 and 1968;

\$14,000.00 on February 1st in each of the years 1969 and 1970;

\$15,000.00 on February 1st in each of the years 1971 and 1972;

\$16,000.00 on February 1st in each of the years 1973 and 1974;

provided, however, that the bonds of said issue maturing on or after February 1, 1963, may be called and redeemed in inverse numerical order upon the payment of the face value thereof, with accrued interest, on February 1, 1962, or any other interest-paying date thereafter. Both principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the City Treasurer of the City of Heppner, Oregon. Interest will be paid semi-annually on February 1st and August 1st of each year.

The net revenues of the sewer system are pledged to the payment of these bonds; provided that when the sinking fund contains more than is required to pay the next annual payment of principal and interest, the excess in said fund may be used to provide extensions and improvements to said system.

Each proposal must specify in multiple of 1/4 of 1% the rate or rates of interest not exceeding 4% per annum, which the bonds are to bear. Said bonds will be sold

for not less than 98% of the par value and accrued interest.

Each bid, except bids submitted by the State of Oregon, must be accompanied by a certified check for 2% of the par value of the bonds, made payable to the city as a guarantee of good faith.

Each bidder is required to include in his bid a statement of the total interest cost and effective interest rate, based upon aggregate interest cost, that the city will pay if his bid is accepted and none of the bonds are called prior to the final maturity date thereof.

The right to reject any and all bids is reserved by the City of Heppner.

The prior legal approving opinion of Messrs. Winfree, McCulloch, Shuler & Sayre, Portland, Oregon, will be furnished the successful bidder.

Plentiful grapes this fall beg to be used every way you know how. Eat them out of hand, of course; use in fruit salads; chop and add to diced chicken, celery and real mayonnaise. Preserve them, too.

More talk of grapes—do 'em this way to top a table fruit centerpiece: Dip clusters of grapes in egg white, coating each grape well. Drain on a cake rack, then dust generously with fine granulated sugar. We call these beauties "Snow Grapes."
