## County Game Agent Receives Promotion

W. V. Masson, 35, game agent for Umatilla and Morrow counties stationed in Pendleton has been named chief of upland game operations for the game commission and will transfer to Portland.

A native of Mt. Vernon, Oregon, Masson has worked as game agent for the commission since 1946 when he was assigned to the Lakeview area. He assumes a post vacated last September by William B. Morse who accepted a regional game supervisor position with the California fish and game department.

Carrying out the Chukar partridge introduction program in Eastern Oregon and setting up a state-wide quail live-trapping and transplanting program will be two of Masson's duties. He will handle all programs dealing with upland game birds and small game animals.

## Defense Bond Sales High For Year

Oregon residents set aside close to \$30 million in Uncle Sam's defense bonds last year, approximately one \$18.75 defense bond for every person.

Purchases of series E bonds by individuals, according to Jeff Carter, county defense bond chairman, amounted to \$23 million 487 thousand, while purchases of the J and K series—available to everyone except commercial banks—totaled \$1 million 71 thousand. Total sales in the county for the year was \$194,272.

Carter stated that last year's E bond sales equaled those for 1951. The J and K series defense bonds, however, were off \$2½ million compared to a year ago. "This noticeable decrease," he said, "occurred early in the year, prior to the introduction of the
