Beats Flood Silt



ST. CHARLES, MO.—Overcoming immense difficulties of silt left behind by Missouri floods, an amazingly successful combining operation was completed on the soybean crop at Bedding Bros. farm here. Flood water which had stood 10 ft. over the fields washed in river sand in varying depths to five feet. In certain areas a deep plowing operation buried the sand to put the black soil back on top. When this was put to soybeans it raised a good crop of 35 to 40 bushels to the acre.

Beans stood 12 inches high in some sections—and were 3 feet high in areas where the deep plowing had taken place. Ordinary tractors with pull-type combines were unable to harvest the crop and buried themselves. Then a Massey-Harris self-propelled combine was brought in and the combining operation was completed in record time.

GAME COMMISSION ANNOUNCES NEW ANGLING REGULATIONS FOR STATE

Final angling regulations set Saturday by the Oregon game commission following a second public hearing in Portland contained no changes in bag limits or trout season openings.

The new 1953 sport fishing regulations must be filed with the Secretary of State and will not be in effect until Saturday, February 7.

In Zone 1 (Costal waters) and Zone 2 (Willamette, Sandy, and Hood River watersheds) trout season will open April 18, and all other areas trout season will open May 2. Trout season will close state-wide October 11. Cascade mountain lakes will be open from May 30 to September 30.

The three items drawing the most anglers and discussion at the second public hearing were Oregon City falls and Wilson river fishing deadlines and elimination of boat fishing on the Alsea river.

Adjustments were made by the commission in the lower deadline at Oregon City falls. The tentative regulation to move the Wilson river deadline downstream from Lees bridge to Jordan creek was dropped and the deadline is the same as last year's. The Alsea river boat fishing closure above the mouth of Mill creek was retained and Lake creek (Stuslaw river tributary) was closed to boat fishing above Deadwood creek.

Fish lake in Linn county was closed to all angling and the opening for Lake of the Woods (Klamath county) was restored to last year's date, May 30.

Special regulations and closures include zone 7 (John Day and Umatilla watersheds) Canyon creek (John Day) closed to all angling within 100 feet radius of the lower end of the culvert at John Day airport.

In zone 9, the Powder, Imhaha, Burnt and Grande Ronde river watersheds: Elkhorn mountain lakes and their tributaries in Baker county, except Anthony, Grande onde and Mud lakes, are
