Here's a molded salad you've been waiting for—made the fast-frost way from start to finish in about one hour! Called a Souffle Salad, here's how: Dissolve 1 package lime or lemon flavored gelatin in 1 cup hot water; add 1/2 cup cold water, 1/2 cup real mayonnaise, 1/4 tsp salt and 1 to 2 tablespoons lemon juice or vinegar. Blend with rotary beater. Pour into refrigerator ice cube tray and place in freezing unit for 15 to 20 minutes. Mixture will be slightly set around the edges, still soft in center.

Step II. Turn mixture back into bowl and beat till frothy. Add 1 to 2 1/2 cups of any salad combination—fish, fruit or vegetables—pour into mold and let set in regular part of refrigerator from 30 to 45 minutes. Creamy and delicious!

On a Sunday morning soon, serve these Country Scrambled Eggs. To the number of eggs you generally scramble, add finely diced cheddar cheese and minced chives.
