The purpose of the election is to submit to the legal voters of the rural school district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1953, over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI of the Constitution. The reasons are increasing such levy are: The low tax base due to the fact that some districts lost their base and others could only be increased 6% per year while costs have gone up more rapidly during and after the war years. Increased costs are due to increased cost of personnel, supplies, equipment, and services; to add services like transportation, hot lunches, music; to bringing school physical plants and equipment up to meet the required standards. The total base for all districts in the Rural School District is \$122,163.10 and the total to be raised by tax is \$438,400.00. The amount of tax, in excess of the six per cent limitation proposed to be levied by the rural school district of Morrow County, Oregon, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1953, is \$316,236.90.
