The reasons for increasing such levy are:

The low tax base due to the fact that some districts lost their base and others could only be increased 6% per year while costs have gone up more rapidly during and after the war years. Increased costs are due to increased cost of personnel, supplies, equipment, and services; to added services like transportation, hot lunches, music; to bringing school physical plants and equipment up to meet the required standards.

The total base for all districts in the Rural School District is \$122,103.10 and the total to be raised by tax is \$438,490.00.

The amount of tax, in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said fiscal year is \$316,386.90.
