**WAGES CLIMB**  
There was an increase of \$60 million in 1952 in payrolls of Oregon firms covered by state unemployment compensation. The increase established an all-time high of \$270,837,444.  
The average monthly wages for all workers also reached a new high of \$348.50 a month as compared with \$303.40 in 1951 and \$256 in 1948.  
**GIRLS STATE SESSION**  
The Girls State annual convention to Salem this week simulated a session of the Oregon legislature in the Senate and House chambers.  
Bills were introduced, discussed and acted upon as in a regular session of the legislature. The procedure was noticeably forthright and modern, with one exception. The "legislatettes" elected state officials from the governor down just as Oregon legislators 50 years ago elected United States Senators.

tory ways of rodent control. Contamination of stored grain by birds is especially important in the case of on-the-farm stored grain, the publication points out. Control is gained by screening windows and blocking all other
