Kenny's Lambs Tops At Auction

HERMISTON—John Kenney of Heppner topped the lamb market at the Hermiston Livestock Auction Friday, with 6 lambs weighing 680 lbs. going for \$14.90 cwt. Delbert Anson, manager of the sale, reports.

Others topping the market included Dimmon Burns, Pendleton, 19 ewes, \$15.00 per hd.; Blaine Noble, Hermiston, 1 190 lb. ewe, \$3.10 cwt.; C. J. Noble, Hermiston, 1 piggy sow, \$70.00 per hd.; Sam Porter, Pilot Rock, 5 weaner pigs, 407 lbs., \$16.50; J. E. Harris, Hardman, 5 feeder pigs, 390 lbs., \$25.30 cwt.; Glen Gray, Stanfield, 5 fats, 965 lbs., \$24.10; William H. Syfford, Stanfield, 1 1000 lb. heifer, \$16.25; Paul Slaughter, Irrigon, 1 1830 lb. bull, \$13.90; Jess Goff, Umatilla, 6 fat calves, 3355 lbs., \$16.65; Fred Rankin, Hermiston, 1 750 lb. heifer, \$16.50.

Volume was up sharply at the sale with 503 cattle consigned compared with 234 at the short sale the previous Friday. Trading was brisk but in a limited price range, with prices generally steady to lower, reflecting a drop in eastern and coastal prices. A top for the year was scored by a Umatilla consignor, Jess Goff, who received \$16.65 swt. for his six fat calves weighing out at 3355 lbs., some \$534 for the lot. These and other heavy calves were up \$1. Feeder cattle were steady as were fat heifers, veal steady to higher largely due to good quality, bulls \$1 lower, commercial cows 50-75c lower, canner-cutter cows 50c lower. Quality was generally lower, with exception of choice heavy calves, fat heifers and other heavy calves grading commercial to good. The heavy volume was largely due, Anson said, to rains

delaying third haying and wheat cleanup and cattle held back the previous week. Active packer buyers included Tex Wilkins of Condon, The Dalles City Pack, Heppner, Toppenish, Grandview, Tacoma, Portland and Silverton packers. Yakima valley feeder buyers were also active. A demand for fat steers went unfilled as did a California order for feeder steers. No fed steers were available although in demand and hard grass steers were also scarce. Top hogs were \$2 lower and feeder and weaner pigs were steady with 147 hogs consigned compared with 88 the previous Friday. Included in the weekly sale was the semi-weekly sheep sale with 372 sheep consigned, compared with 265 at the previous sale and 114 the previous Friday. Lambs were generally \$1 below the previous sale. Calves—Baby calves 6.00-17.50 hd.; weaner calves 13.50-16.50 cwt.; feeder calves 9.50-12.50 cwt.; veal 16.50-18.20 cwt. Steers—Stocker steers 11.50-13.75 cwt.; feeder steers 14.50-15.40; fat slaughter steers—none consigned, a few dairy type steers at 13.50 cwt.; fat heifers 14.30-16.50 cwt. Cows—Dairy cows 8.00-130.00 hd.; dairy heifers 27.50-41.00 hd.; stock cows 8.50-10.60 cwt. Slaughter cows—Commercial 11.30-12.20 cwt.; utility 9.75-11.00; canner-cutter 7.10-8.75; shells down to 4.50. Bulls—12.50-13.90 cwt. Hogs—Weaner pigs 9.75-16.50 hd.; feeder pigs 24.10-25.30 cwt.
