Boardman Grange Entertains County Council

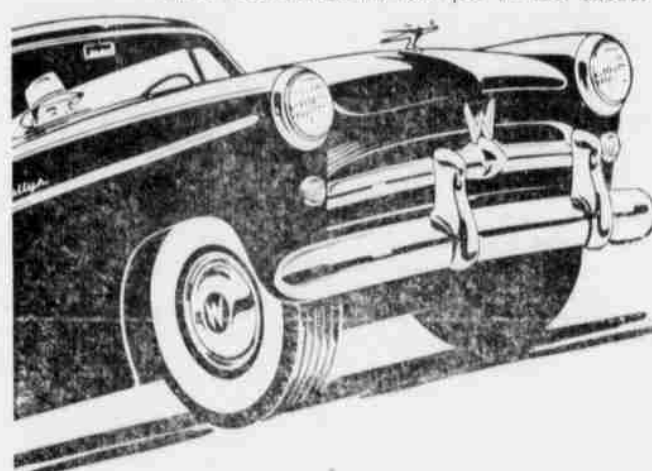

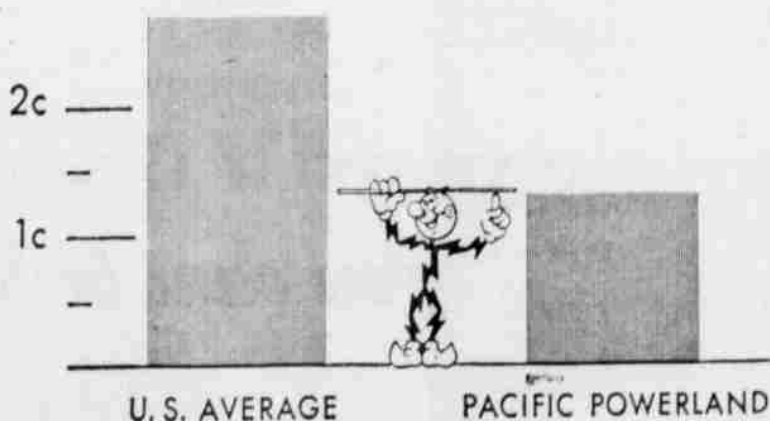
