FAIRS WANT RACING FUNDS

The Oregon Fairs Association meeting in Salem last week adopted a resolution opposing any alteration of the present distribution of pari-mutuel revenues. The state now gets 60 per cent and the fairs 40 per cent.

One of the time-wasting and costly scraps at the 1953 legislature was a proposed reclassification of fairs participating in the distribution of racing revenue. The possibility of the entire fund being turned into the general fund brought about the defeat of the proposal.

Other resolutions adopted at the four-day meeting, that closed Friday night would:

Prepare legislation to cover the safe operation of amusement rides and shows and governing their inspection.

Provide more youth activities with better facilities, larger

TAX CUTS MURKY

Slightly lower federal income tax rates will not necessarily mean higher take-home pay, citizens were reminded this week by the state tax commission.

The higher social security tax deductions, going up from 1 1/2 to 2 per cent Jan. 1, might offset any savings in lower income tax withholdings.

Some lower paid workers with families will find their combined tax payments increased.

The reduction in federal rates is expected to increase state income tax revenues by between \$1 and \$2 million a year.

NEW LEGAL OPINIONS

Interpretations of Oregon laws

recently made by Attorney General, Robert Y. Thornton, include:

A state employee, who after release from military duty, gives notice to employer of intention to return voluntarily for further extended active duty with the armed forces, is not reporting for duty with employer and is therefore not entitled to the benefits and performances provided for employees taking automatic leaves of absence.

The corporation commissioner may accept articles of incorporation for filing under the new Oregon Business Corporation Act which do not contain the names and addresses of an initial board of directors.

The power reserved to the people to initiate "laws" does not in-

clude the power to initiate resolutions or memorials to Congress.

Circuit courts have implied power to order temporary commitment for presentence examination at Oregon State Hospital.

MORSE ON OREGON TOUR

"It's going to take more than just sneers to defeat Sen. Wayne Morse if he runs for reelection in 1956," said a republican party leader when leaving the Salem High School last Friday night where Morse delivered the seventh of 24 lectures on his Oregon agenda this month.

"If we keep on merely laughing this shrewd pundit may have the last laugh," the republican quipped.

Morse, who rebelled against the Eisenhower policies, lists himself as a Constitutional Liberal and says he got that way holding ethical political decisions aloof from party manipulations. The immediate issues of government are too vital and sacred to be blurred by politics, he declared.

Morse explained his political situation, saying, "I never re-

signed from the republican party until the republican party resigned from the principals of Abraham Lincoln."

When questioned if he would support Richard Neuberger for governor, he replied, "Yes, with great enthusiasm."

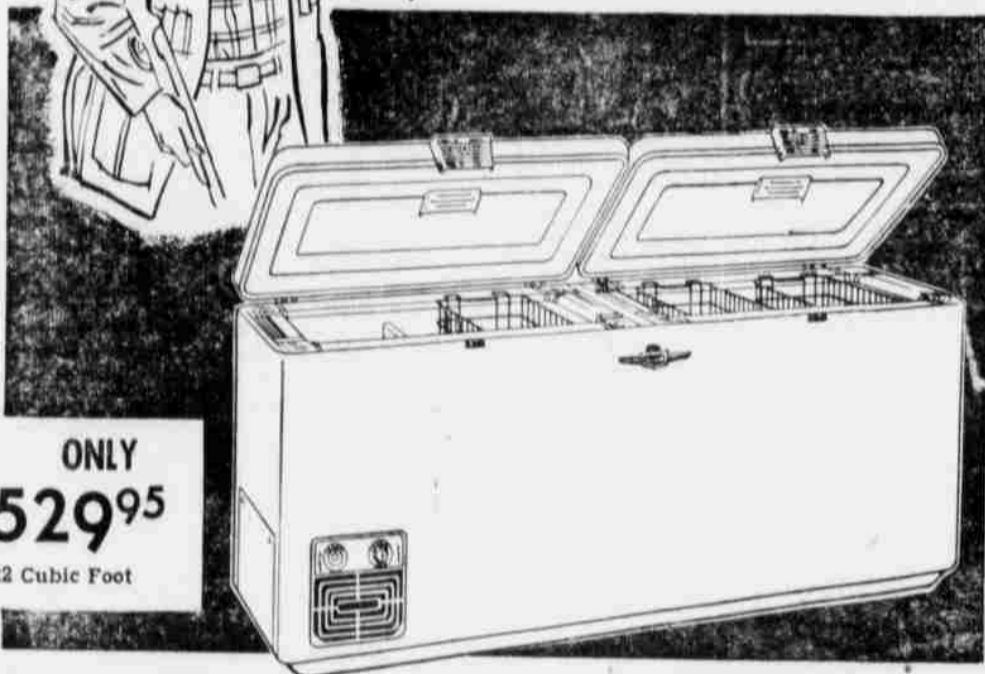
