weeks here with her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Nathan Thorpe.

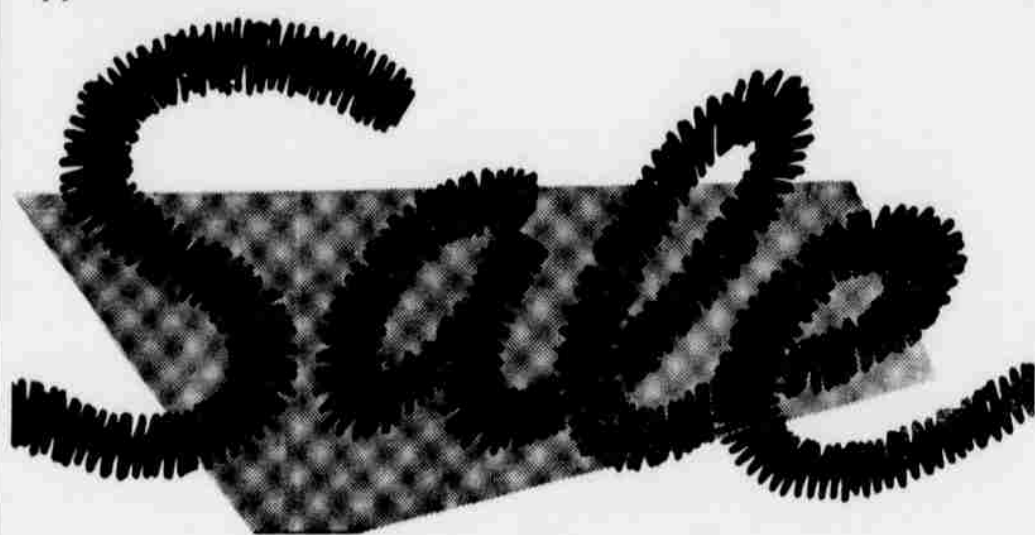
