FIRST NATIONAL EXPANDS WITH PURCHASE OF 15 AFFILIATED BANKS

The 88-year-old First National
Bank of Portland will become the
largest bank in the Pacific North-
west on February 8 by acquiring
the banking business and assum-
ing the deposit liabilities of its
15 affiliated banks with 18 offices
scattered throughout Oregon, C.
B. Stephenson said.

The acquisition will involve
millions, making the banking
transaction the largest in the
state's history.

The board of directors has
authorized a \$16 million increase
in capital, to be made available
through the sale of 400,000 addi-
tional shares of stock, subject to
the approval of the stockholders,
Stephenson revealed.

The proposal will be submitted
to a special meeting of the stock-
holders on February 23rd, and if
approved, stockholders of record
at the close of business on Febru-
ary 26, 1954 will receive the right
to purchase an additional share
for each three shares then owned,
at the subscription price of \$40
per share.

Banks involved in the transac-
tion, and their December 31, 1953
deposit figures, are the First
Molokai-Sellwood, located in
Southeast Portland, \$8,200,092;
First National Bank of Eugene
and Springfield, \$62,355,556; First
Carlton Bank, \$1,130,952; First
Silverton Bank, \$4,903,945; First
National Bank of Forest Grove,
\$4,710,179; First Seaside Bank,
\$5,132,114; First National Bank of
Cottage Grove, \$7,927,106; First
National Bank of Prineville, \$7-
691,230.

Others include the First Seio
Bank, \$1,397,385; the First Sweet
Home Bank, \$3,966,056; First Cor-
vallis Bank, and its branch at
Philomath, \$14,598,925; First
Yamhill Bank, \$1,486,066; First
Monroe Bank, \$1,200,525; First
National Bank of Lebanon, \$11-
307,885; and the First Ontario
Bank, \$3,137,174.

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
