Sprays for Sagebrush Told in Bulletin

Use of chemical spray that gave up to 80 percent control of sagebrush in Eastern Oregon trials at a cost of \$3 to \$4 an acre is reported in a new bulletin published by the Oregon State college experiment station.

The bulletin is based on re-

search by Donald N. Hyder, range conservationist at the Squaw Butte-Harney branch experiment station near Burns. The station is operated jointly by the OSC experiment station and the U. S. department of the interior.

Comparative results with two forms of 2,4-D and 2,4,5-T, how to apply them, the best time to spray, and condition of range growth for best results are discussed in station bulletin 538, "Spray To Control Big Sagebrush." Copies are available on request from county extension agents or the college.
