MENTAL ILLS INCREASE "The big problem is to provide care and treatment for mentally ill persons before it is necessary to commit them to a hospital". Melvin Murphy, director of the Oregon Mental Health Association told members at a meeting this week at the Capitol. Murphy attended a national meeting in Michigan recently where health groups reported that virtually all mental hospitals in the United States are taxed to capacity with their population increasing faster than new facilities. "The early retirement plan," Murphy emphasized, "would cut down mental hospital commitments and relieve the taxpayers of a lot of expense." Adjustment of employment for persons over 65 who have been retired but who want to continue active is alleviating the increase of mental cases in cities and should be extended. He cited an example of a large store that made a successful effort in giving employment to retired salespeople. With an experienced happy crew thrilled with a new look on life, this store was magnetizing trade from other stores.

GOT THE WRONG NUMBER Because she got the wrong number, a Portland woman was awarded \$87 damages by a jury. The wrong number she got was in her advertisement in the telephone book. When Nettie P. Sheridan sued the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company for \$25,000 damages the trial judge instructed the jury that damages should be held to the cost of the advertisement, as she had not filed a bill of expectations. She appealed to the Oregon Supreme Court. Sitting en banc the high court this week affirmed the judgment of the lower court.

WATER PROBLEM GROWS Water will largely determine how Oregon will develop and prosper it was declared by members of the Oregon Water Resources Committee meeting in the Capitol this week. The water problem in this state is much more serious than the average citizen realizes. Not only are streams that formerly ran but the water year around, now dry, but water levels in wells are lowering rapidly on valley floors and a difference is showing in hill and mountains. The agenda of the committee includes ten or twelve meetings over the state. At the conclusion of hearings commission members will prepare legislative recommendations for the 1955 session.

Following the order of a grand jury probe in Lincoln county District Attorney W. T. Hollen this week asked Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton to aid him in a renewed investigation of reports of vice and corruption in Lincoln county. In a prior investigation eight months ago a Lincoln county grand jury brought in no charges against anyone. This started conclaves of coast groups and citizens who called on Gov. Paul L. Patterson. Some of the callers

asked Patterson to direct Attorney General Thornton to intervene, others assured the governor that all was well and that another investigation was not necessary. Patterson declined to order an investigation. JAR STATE OFFICES There has been much spastic Continued on Page 6
